Entries must be received by 10th AUGUST. Class tickets will be supplied when Exhibitors arrive to bench their exhibits unless a LARGE S.A.E. is enclosed with entry form and fee. One admission ticket will be issued free if entries amount to more than £5. All Exhibits must be benched by 9.30 am on Saturday 11th August when judging will commence. Removal time will be 5.00 pm.

The committee reserves the right to withhold or diminish the Prize of any CLASS or where there are insufficient entries. The Judges' decision is final. Careful arrangements for the protection of exhibits will be made, but the committee will not be responsible for any injury or damage they may sustain before, during or after the Exhibition. Sampling for judging purposes will be at the Judges' discretion. The committee's decision will be final and legally binding on all questions, acceptance of this rule is an express condition of entry.
