Halifax Agricultural Show Equestrian Rules of Entry

1. 1st prize money will only be awarded in classes with up to 4 entries. 1st & 2nd prize money will be awarded in classes with 5 – 8 entries, 1st 2nd & 3rd prize money will be awarded in classes with 9 or more entries. All prize money to be collected on day of the Show.
2. Entries accepted by post or BACS payment online – see Entry form for full details.
3. The organisers accept no responsibility for loss or damage, injury or accident to spectators, exhibitors, riders or their property as a result of attending this show. Please take appropriate care to prevent such accident or loss to yourselves and others. All competitors must hold suitable Public Liability insurance and a valid equine passport.
4. Equine Influenza – Equine Influenza and Tetanus vaccinations are a compulsory requirement for all horses attending the Halifax Agricultural Show. The requirement for the first 3 vaccinations is as follows: the first 2 vaccinations 21 – 92 days apart, a third booster between 150-215 days, and an annual booster vaccination within 365 days thereafter. No horse should enter competitions within 7 days of an EI vaccination. Foals should commence vaccinations at 6 months old. This Rule may be subject to change from guidance from the FEI/BEF and any changes will be notified via the Showing Council and ASAO websites. The current FEI ruling is for a six monthly booster as opposed to annual.
5. Riders must wear up to date hard hats secured with a chin strap. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 along with another accepted standard, will be permitted. For example, BSEN1384 & PAS015 (1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark or Inspec IC mark will be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own. This also applies to handlers 15 years and under.
6. No persons other than the exhibitor, handler, judges and stewards are allowed into the rings.
7. No horse/pony under 4yrs will be allowed to compete in any ridden class.
8. No exercising of horses or ponies in the parking area. Please use the designated collecting ring only. No cantering/galloping outside of the competition rings. No lunging anywhere on the showground.
9. Age for horse/pony and rider as at 1st January 2020.
10. All stallions and colts should be suitably bitted and handled by persons 16 yrs. and over.
11. The organiser's reserve the right to divide, amalgamate or cancel any classes should entries warrant it.
12. If an entry is late for a class, due to competing in another ring, the judge may wait 5 mins, or allow late entry to the ring, entirely at his/her own discretion. No refunds will be made.
13. The Judge's decision is final. Any formal objections should be made in writing (official form available from the Secretary's marquee) and handed to the Secretary, accompanied by a deposit of £20, before leaving the show. The deposit will be refunded if the objection is upheld and you will be notified of the decision by post.
14. No horse/pony to be left unattended tied outside a horsebox/trailer.
15. No mucking out on the showground and please take all litter home with you.
16. Mistreatment of any animal on the Showground will not be tolerated. The organisers reserve the right to ask anyone to leave.
17. By entering any class you agree to abide by the rules above. The above rules are additional to the general show rules.

TSR NAF FIVE STAR SHOWING FINALS - This show is a qualifier for the 2020 TSR NAF Five Star Showing Finals. Qualify and enter ANY of the Finals Central, East Anglia, North West, North East, South East, South, Wales & South West or Scottish. You Do Not have to be a TSR member to qualify or enter a final. The Rider/Handler qualifies and can enter any horse/pony in any number of Finals!

TSR NAF FIVE STAR RIDERS FINALS - 1st & 2nd riders qualify and will receive a qualification flyer in the ring.

TSR NAF FIVE STAR IN HAND FINALS - The two highest placed Handlers with a TSR In Hand sheet will qualify in any In Hand class. Handlers MUST have their sheet signed in the ring by the judge/steward, cards are available FREE from the TSR website.

Open to members and non-members. All competitors and grooms must adhere to VHS Rules in all circumstances. Failure to do so may result in immediate disqualification.

VHS Regional Final qualification. All competitors placed 1st to 4th in each age category will qualify for the corresponding class at VHS Regional Finals. Members must carry their cards in the ring and have their showing card signed by the judge in the ring as proof of qualification. Non-members will receive a red qualification card which can be exchanged for signed showing card when applying for VHS membership. It is the competitors responsibility to present their Showing card to the judge.

Regional Finals are open to members only.

All competitors are eligible to enter open classes at the National Veteran Championships, to be held at Arena UK Lincolnshire on 2nd - 4th October 2020. No qualification or membership necessary. See VHS website for schedule.

In the event of insufficient entries lower prizes may be withheld. Rule - 76.6

Open to non-registered or British Showjumping Club competitors on horses and ponies. Senior riders should be turning 17 years old or older in the current year. Stallions are not permitted to jump in any Club classes.

Qualifying period: 1st July 2020 to 30th June 2021

Numbers to qualify: The Top 20 from each of the four height category league tables, will qualify for the National Club Championships held at the British Showjumping National Championships. Club registered horse (or pony)/rider combinations are eligible to qualify and in more than one height category.

Points 1st = 12, 2nd = 10, 3rd = 8, 4th = 6, 5th = 4, 6th = 3. Double Clear Points = 3.

Points are allocated depending on the number of starters; every one in five starters is eligible for points. If you gain a double clear you will receive three points regardless of starters. If a combination competes in more than two consecutive height classes per show day only the points from the bigger classes will be graded.

British Showjumping Boots / Leg Protection Ruling applies to these classes, in accordance with Rule 102.15. Failure to comply will incur disqualification.

SHOW JUMPING CLASSES

Class 4a SENIOR BRITISH NOVICE CHAMPIONSHIP - FIRST ROUND

Rule 316. Single Phase. Speed 325mpm. Start Height 90cm.

Horses may compete in one section only. In the event of insufficient entries lower prizes may be withheld. Rule - 76.6. Sections to be split with 2 sets of prizemoney awarded.

Entry qualifications: to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

- a) For Horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 125 points. Four Double Clears will qualify - in accordance with Rule 316.6.
- b) For all horses born on or after 1 January 2016 irrespective of points. Horses will only be eligible for double clear qualification to Second Rounds if they reach the age of four years or under in the same calendar year as the British Novice Final - in accordance with Rule 316.6

Qualifies for: Senior British Novice Championship - Second Round.

Qualifying period yearly 1st May - 30th April inclusive.

Numbers to Qualify: Those horses which jump a clear round in the first round, followed by a clear round in the jump off, in at least four British Novice First Round competitions held in any qualifying period will qualify to compete in the British Novice Second Rounds, irrespective of their placings for prize money in those competitions, which will be determined by the normal Table (A) rules (Rule 191). Horses in the class must go into the jump-off and go clear to gain a double clear round qualification.

Entry qualifications: to be ridden by Adult, Associate or Junior Members.

- a) For Horses in Grade C that have not won a total of 225 points. Four Double Clears will qualify - in accordance with Rule 314.6.
- b) For all horses born on or after 1 January 2015 irrespective of points. Horses will only be eligible for double clear qualification to Second Rounds if they reach the age of five years or under in the same calendar year as the Discovery Final - in accordance with Rule 314.6.

Qualifies for: Nupafeed Supplements Discovery Championship Second Round.
